



Diverse Cultural Unit


- Goal is to improve provision of culturally supported care
- Recognize individuals who may benefit from additional supports
- In March 2020, Communicable Disease Control had about 50 staff
- We now have about 1,500 staff
- This includes numerous individuals who have self identified with unique language skills and/or connections to Alberta's culturally diverse communities
- These staff are part of our Diverse Cultural Unit

Pod Partnership Model

- A blend of regulated and non-regulated staff for case investigations
- Regulated Pod Leads collaborate with nonregulated staff

How we are supporting Albertans in Diverse Cultural Communities

- Identification of local geographic area
- Collection of information on people's ethnicity
- Offer community supports if required by the individual
 - 211 for social supports
 - mental health help line
 - Difficulty with Home
