The City of Calgary – COVID Vaccine Taskforce

Responsibilities

Support the province in delivery of Covid vaccinations to Calgarians, including support in the form of:

- Identifying and providing vaccination sites;
- Assisting with communication to Calgarians;
- Providing sector priorities;
- Acting as the singular representative to the province for city services;
- Identifying and working with local community groups as necessary;
- Transportation of Calgarians to and from vaccine sites;
- Represent external agency members of the Calgary Emergency Management Agency in discussions and proceedings relating to the distribution of vaccines;
- Other forms of support not associated with the direct application of healthcare services.

Calgary Neighbourhoods

- Subject matter expert in community relations and liaise with community groups to identify unique considerations and solutions for the vaccination of Calgary's communities;
- Liaise with Civic Partners and non-profit organizations.






The City of Calgary – COVID Vaccine Taskforce

Community Considerations

- Calgary Neighbourhoods has engaged with non-profit organizations,
 Civic Partners, City staff, and community to document offers of support,
 considerations, recommendations, and advocacy related to vaccine planning
 and implementation with a particular focus on populations experiencing
 vulnerability.
- Organizations have offered facilities to act as vaccination sites
- Support communication of accurate information to the community in partnership with the Government of Alberta, Alberta Health Services, and non-profit organizations and partners
- Coordinating information from community to Vaccine Task Force, including data from the Calgary East Zone Newcomer Collaborative on vaccine willingness




Calgary East Zone Newcomer Collaborative




Question 2: If the answer is "Definitely not going for vaccination" or Undecided. Explain why.
